The 30 farmers taking the lead for the new project in Kisumu West, Kenya, are now well into their three months of training. As we explained in our last <u>newsletter</u>, this is the first project for *Farmers Alliance for Restoration, East Africa* as they start to build on the work of the permEzone pilot programme.

In his latest updates from the project, which you can read in full <u>here</u>, Paul briefly outlines the first eight weekly trainings, and says that the full-hearted engagement of the farmers with the process bodes well for the impact this will have in the future.

Meanwhile, our plans for Farmers Alliance for Restoration (FAR) are moving along.
